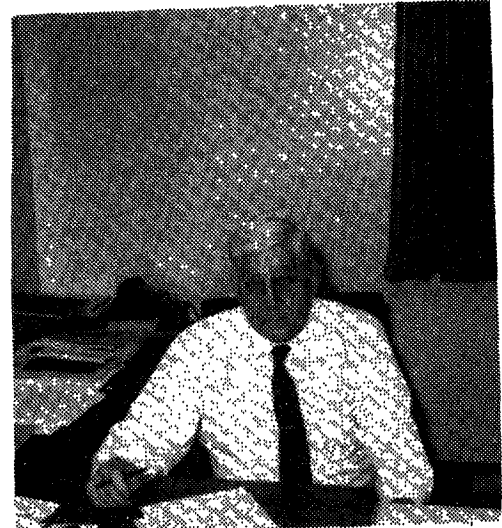

FRANK C. KOSTOS, FORMER DIRECTOR - HAZLETON P.S.U.

The Frank C. Kostos Award has been established at The Pennsylvania State University by friends of Mr. Kostos, who was director of the Hazleton Campus from 1954 until his retirement on July 1, 1973, and earlier had served on the engineering faculty at Hazleton, beginning in 1946.

The award will be made annually to the Hazleton Campus student, in the baccalaureate degree program ranking highest at the end of the sophomore year, and to the highest ranking student who is eligible to receive the associate degree.

The award will consist of a replica of the Nittany Lion, appropriately inscribed, and a sum of money.

Recipients will be selected by the scholarship committee of the Hazleton Campus with the approval of the director of student aid.

Mr. Kostos, a native of Mt. Carmel, is a 1930 graduate of Bucknell University where he received his master of science degree in 1939.
