Mr. Caccese was the first student to win the Eric A. Walker Award at the Hazleton campus. He also won the Sophomore of the Year Award, and the Academic Achievement Leadership Award in 1969.

At present, he is teaching Health at Bishop Hafey High School

in Hazle Township and also serves as coach for the B.H.H.S. soccer and baseball teams. He also informed the COLLEGIAN that if the opportunity arises, he would like to become a full-time faculty member here at Highacres.
