Spring intercollegiate soccer has been dominated by good scoring on the part of the Highacres dynamos who currently possess a 2-win to 1-loss record. In the battle against Capital Campus, Hazleton slipped to defeat 3-2. Mr. Ron Biggers and Ken Heydt scored the two goals. In the Schuylkill game, Highacres booters eased to a 2-0 victory, with Hugo Correa chalking up both goals. Bill Schaffer recorded the shut-out as goalie. In the big Wilkes-Barre contest, Tim Weller smacked in 4 goals, followed by Correa with 2, and Dennis Catino and Bill Finerfrock with 1 apiece, Goalies Finerfrock and Ken Wong recorded the shut-out.

In the opening game against the Scranton Campus, the individual scores were as follows: Ron Makuta, Carl Makuta, and Chris Krajnik 81 apiece; Tom Chirico and Mike Laukashunas 83 each; Gene Babon with a total of 89.

The Highacres team smashed Schuylkill 15 to 3 in its second game of the season. The third game, played at the Sugarloaf home course against Wilkes-Barre, resulted in an 11½ to 6½ Hazleton match-point victory. In individual scoring, Carl Makuta was high man with 77; followed by Krajnik, 80; Babob and Ron Makuta, 82;

Laukashunas, 85; and Chirico, 87. This puts the Highacres winning streak at 3-0.
