FINANCIAL AID DEADLINES

All Confidential Statements should be forwarded to the College Scholarship Service one month in advance of deadline dates to insure a timely arrival of processed PCS or SFS in the Office of Student Aid.

The Financial Aid Application for the summer 1975 is due March 14, 1975. Applications are available from the Office of Student Aid or the Branch Campus Dean's Office. Your 1974-1975 or 1975-1976 Confidential Statement must be on file with the Office of Student Aid by this date.

The 1975-76 Penn State Applications for Financial Aid (National Direct Student Loan, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, College Work-Study Program, and University Loans) <u>must</u> be filed by April 1, 1975. No application will be considered without a 1975-76 Confidential Statement (PCS/SFS). Applications and Confidential Statements are available from the Office of Student Aid or the Branch Campus Dean's Office.

The suggested filing date for BEOG is available to students who began a post-secondary education for the first time after April 1, 1973. 1975-76 applications may be filed with BEOG until April 1, 1976. Applications available in Office of Student Aid or the Branch Campus Dean's Office.

The 1975-76 applications for PHEAA grants for Pennsylvania residents are due (for all categories of students) before May 1, 1975. Renewal students, prefreshmen, returning students, transfer students, new applicants and veteran students must have a completed application received by the PHEAA Agency before May 1, 1975. Freshmen and renewal students will receive applications

from PHEAA. All others should obtain applications from the Office of Student Aid or the Branch Campus Dean's Office.

The PHEAA Summer Work-Study Program, if available, will be announced in March.

Summer PHEAA Grants, if available, will be announced in May or June.

No official deadline, but allow at less

There is no official deadline, but allow at least six to eight weeks for processing. Applications should be obtained from the student's lending institution (bank, savings and loan association, credit union, etc) and should be submitted to the Office of Student Aid with a stamped envelope addressed to the lender. Students who are applying for loans through agencies other than PHEAA should supply a self-addressed stamped envelope. Undergraduates may request up to \$2,000 and gra-

duates up to \$2,500 per academic level (freshman, sophomore, junior, senior)—both pending bank and Guarantse Agencies may differ on the amount of loan a student may receive.


