the necessary documents can be released without any red tape. Educational agencies can use the records for the purpose of developing validation and administering predictive tests. In this case the student's identity is to be withheld. And, finally, the parents of a dependent student have the right to examine his or her records. The Internal Revenue Service defines a dependent student as one who attended and educational institution full-time for any five calendar months of a tax year and who has paid for less than one half of his support.

A student is entitled to challenge and/or add information to the record. This is to insure that inaccurate or misleading entries are not on record which would be damaging to the student.
