Budget falls short

UNIVERSITY PARK--Gov. Milton J. Shapp in his budget message last month recommended an appropriation of \$106,730,000 for The Pennsylvania State University for 1976-77.

The amount is an increase of \$4,022,000 or 3.91 percent increase over the \$102,708,000 appropriated for the current year.

University officials last September had requested \$118,711,000 or an increase of 15.58 percent over the 1975-76 appropriation. The request included \$3,690,000 for medical education programs in the College of Medicine at The Milton S. Hershey Medical Center of the University, urging an increase in the per capita amount for medical education from the level of \$7,465 that has been in effect for a number of years to \$10,000. The budget recommended by the Governor maintains the \$7,465 per capita amount.
