The facilities in the new complex include swimming, to be open in the near future; weightlifting, in the universal room anytime from 9:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M., and bowling on Wednesday nights from 6-9:00 P.M. (tentative), with the cost being \$.50 per game and 3 games for \$1.00.

The gym open hours announced above have been placed in jeopardy through vandalism that is going on. Incidents including the ripping off a wall of a sink and the plugging of several toilets with paper, and if continued, will close the building to except for scheduled classes and intramural activity.
