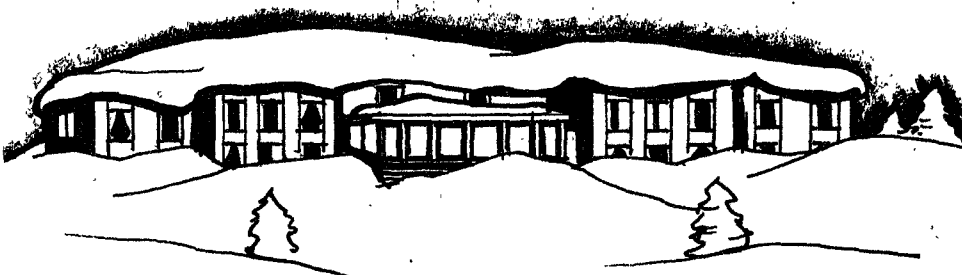

## ANNOUNCEMENT

Applications for the position of Resident Assistant for 1979-80 on the Hazleton Campus Residential Life Staff can be obtained in the Residence Hall Office. The deadline for applying is Wednesday, January 17, 1979. For their efforts as counselors, programmers, referral agents, and enforcers of University Regulations, R.A.'s receive a waiver of fees for room and board.

Candidates for Resident assistantships should be available for enrollment in a training course offered during Spring Term 1979 (sessions are held two evenings per week).

### MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR THE POSITION:

1. Enrollment as a student at The Pennsylvania State University, Hazleton Campus.
2. At least fourth term standing at the onset of employment.
3. At least a 2.50 cumulative grade point average. (Resident Assistants must also maintain at 2.50 G.P.A. Grades are reviewed by the supervisor each term).
4. Satisfactory progress in an academic program, permitting

the Resident Assistant to register for no more than twelve credits (preferably ten) each term.

5. A schedule of classes which permits the Resident Assistant to be available to the students in his unit during the evening hours.

6. Willingness to perform all duties of the position as set forth in the job description including willingness to personally abide by and enforce all University regulations.

7. A satisfactory conduct record (normally a conduct record consisting of no disciplinary action more severe than Disciplinary Warning within the past three terms and indicating not more than one violation is considered satisfactory).

8. Inter-personal skills enabling the Resident Assistant to relate effectively with the students in his unit and with other staff members.

9. A commitment to serve at least three terms.

10. All candidates must attend a meeting on January 17, 1979 at 7:00 p.m. in the Residence Hall lobby to initiate selection procedures.
