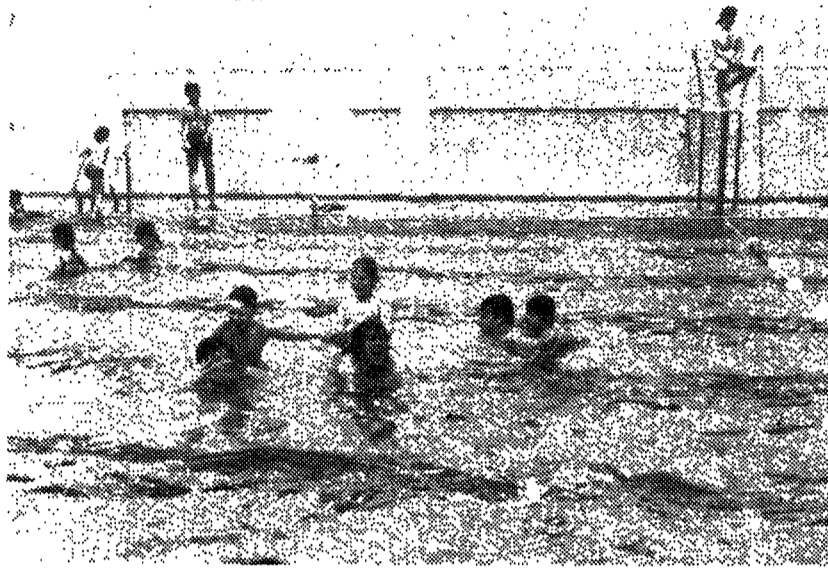
SGA is in the process of looking into getting the library to stay open later at night for extended student use.
