

On December 19-20 the Highacres Holiday Classic was held. In the first night of play the Condors defeated Allentown Campus, and Schuylkill defeated Wilkes-Barre. In the second night of play in the consolation Wilkes-Barre came back and defeated Allentown in a close game. 
### SCHUYLKILL GAME
