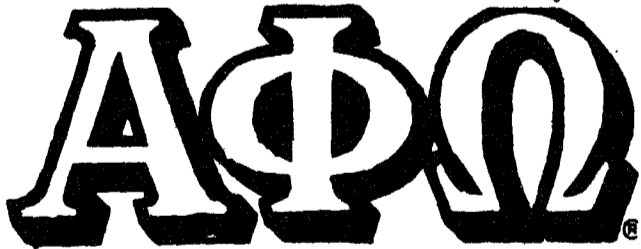
Finally, to the Administration, especially Dean McCallum and Ev Binns the help that you two gave me throughout this year was priceless. I appreciated all of it. Thank you.
