

Highacres poll finds Kennedy the winner

The year 1979 is nearing an end, and the year 1980 is approaching. One of the most important features of 1980 for American citizens aged 18 and over will be the presidential primary election. In conjunction with this, 10 percent of the student body at Penn State Highacres Campus were recently asked the following question: "If in the upcoming Democratic primary election President Carter and Massachusetts Senator Ted Kennedy were the two principal candidates, who would you vote for?" Senator Kennedy was victorious over President Carter,

and the number of votes in favor of Senator Kennedy total as follows: sophomore males—67 percent, freshman males—75 percent, sophomore females—80 percent and freshman females—79 percent. Also, 5 percent of the students surveyed stated that they wouldn't vote for either candidate. Of course, the results of this survey do not mean that Senator Kennedy will emerge as the victor in the upcoming primary election, but if Penn Staters from Highacres Campus reach the polls, Ted Kennedy will be the Democratic candidate for the Presidency.
