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BP screening approaches

Health Services, under the direction of Mrs. Margaret Tamea, nurse, has requested the Pennsylvania Department of Health to conduct a blood pressure screening here on campus in April. Included with the screening will be specialized counseling, height and weight measurements, and blood work. The blood work, which is optional, will be done at a minimal cost. A finger-stick test for diabetes will be done free of charge. The screening will be conducted on Tuesday, April 20, in the Physical Education Building, Room 106, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Anyone interested in taking advantage of this program must complete a history form in the Dispensary, Administration Building, no later than April 16 and set up a convenient time between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. on the day of screening.

Car registration is mandatory

All students are reminded to register their cars for spring term if they have not already done so. Students may park in student lot "A" and "B" (triple level), which include the dorm lot.

No one will be allowed to park in the physical education lot unless directed by security. It is the student's responsibility to be familiar with the rules and regulations of parking on campus. A copy of the rules and regulations can be obtained in the Business Office.

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
