Mr. Cerula was selected on the basis of his outstanding service to the community. He has played an active role

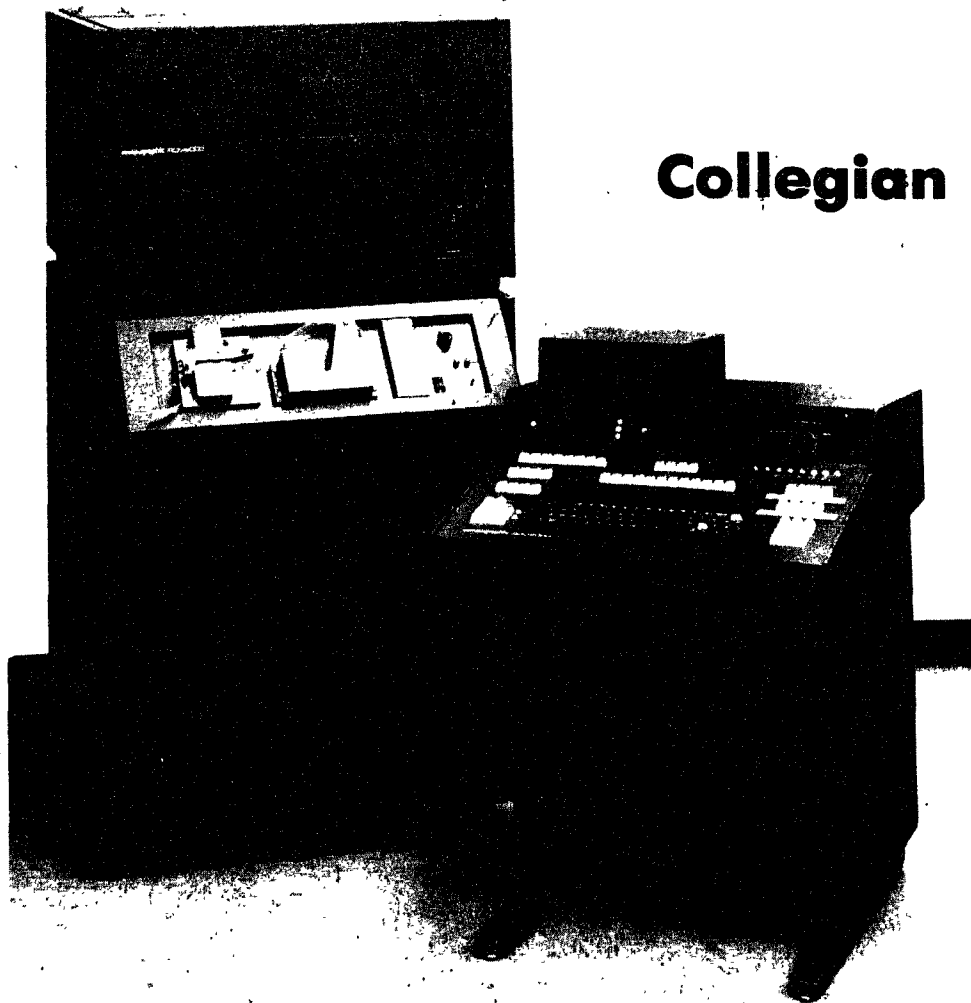

Collegian purchases typesetter

In an effort to cut costs and increase efficiency, the Highacres Collegian has purchased a typesetter from the Daily Collegian Corporation.

The machine was purchased at a cost of \$1,000, five hundred of which was paid by Campus Director, Dr. William David, through the Director's Account.

"Normally, a machine of this nature would be put on our books as being worth about \$4,000, but since we're selling it to a branch campus, and we know it will be put to good use, we've come down on the price," said Gerry Hamilton, General Manager of the Daily Collegian.

The sale came after the Highacres Collegian's Associate Editor, Lori Emerich, learned of the possibility of obtaining the machine. "I had been looking into the acquisition of a typesetter for quite some time, so naturally when the opportunity came along I pursued it," said Emerich.

Collegian Layout Editor, Joe Krushinsky, first learned about the machine during a recent visit to State College. "It was put to me as a joke,"
