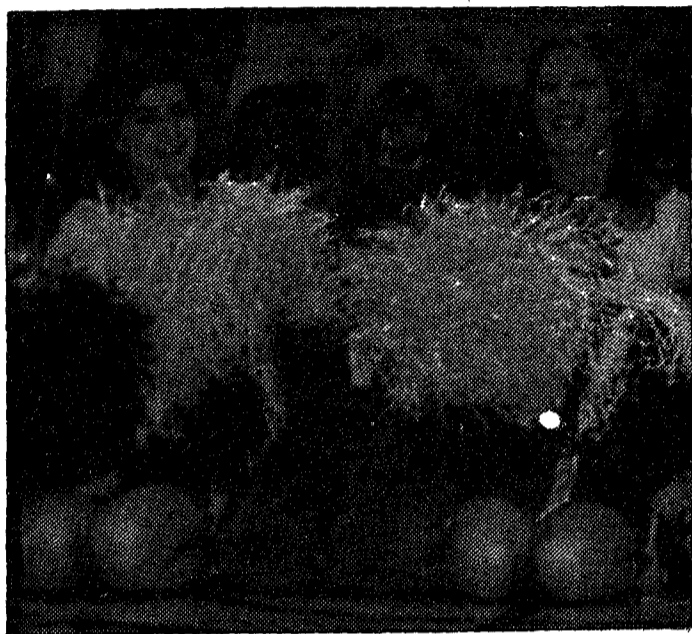
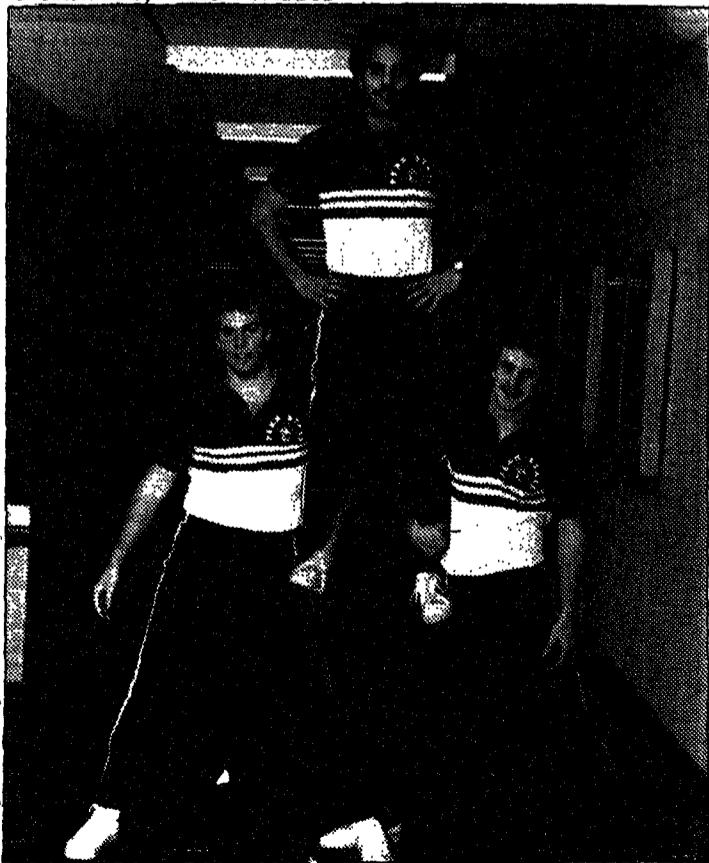


Cheerleaders

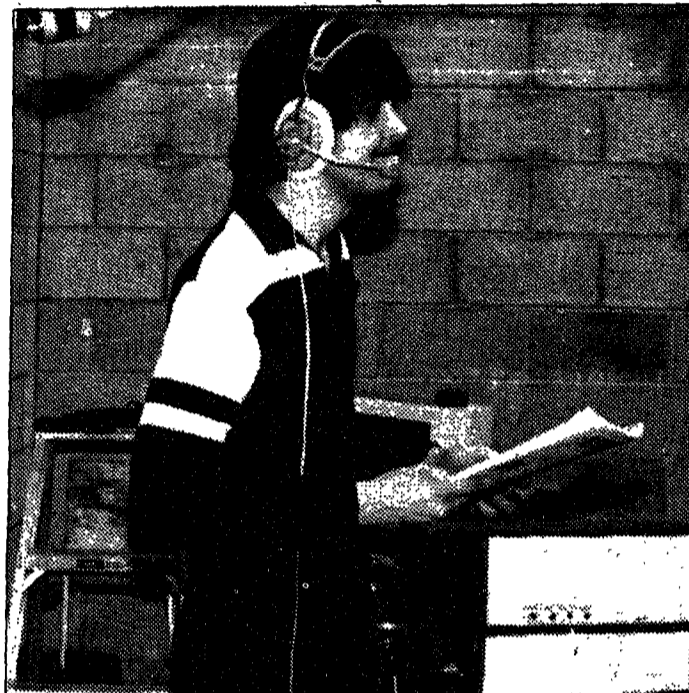
Parnassus
