Classroom Building Renamed For Kostos

The classroom/laboratory building, constructed 15 years ago while Frank C. Kostos was director of the Hazleton Campus, will be renamed in his honor at a ceremony scheduled for Sunday, May 19.

The name change received official sanction in January at a meeting of the Board of Trustees of The University. The action was taken at the request of Dr. David for the Hazleton Campus with support from the Hazleton Educational Council, the Faculty General Assembly and the Student Government Association.

Mr. Kostos headed the Hazleton Campus from 1954 until his retirement in 1973. He died March 12, 1984 at age 73.

It was during the 19 years of his leadership that the campus experienced its greatest growth, both in number of students and size of the physical plant. Many of the associate degree programs were established during his tenure and the student population doubled in size to reach 750.

The Residence Hall, the Dining Hall, the Library, and the Classroom Building were all constructed during his years as director and plans were developed and approval obtained for the Physical Education Building.

The rededication and renaming ceremony is being planned by a committee consisting of Dr. Michael Matsko, Dr. Eugene Miller, Dr. Michael Santulli, Joseph McCallus and Karl Krone.
