

The large classroom units are needed because of a shortage of space, said Ralph E. Zilly, University vice president for business. Each temporary unit contains one classroom.

The 24-by-60 foot units will be installed on concrete foundation piers on the south side of Parking Area C, near the Physical Education Building. Each unit will accommodate between fifty and sixty students.

The units will be gifts from the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company, Zilly explained.

Electric baseboard heating, carpeting, fire extinguishers and chalkboards will be installed in both units. Wood stairs will be constructed from the parking lot level down to the units.

Zilly said he hopes that the units will be available in time for the summer school session.
