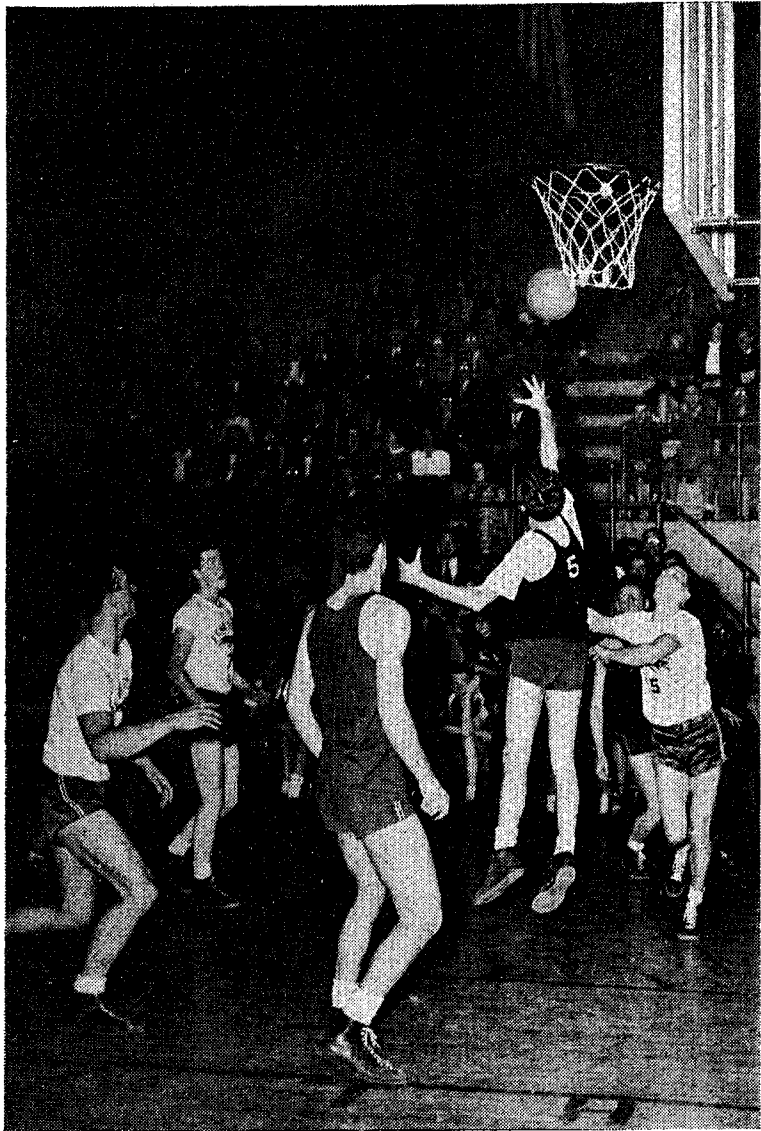


HUC AT POTTSVILLE

This game was played in preliminary to the Penn State-Washington and Jefferson tilt in which Penn State was defeated, 48-46.

Paced by Johnny Riley and Al Durbach who tallied 37 points between them, HUC defeated a classy Bucknell Jr. College quintet, 53-48, to hang up their third consecutive win of the season against no losses.

Although HUC trailed at the end of the first quarter, 17-15, scintillating shots by Riley, Hazleton's "dead-eye," put the locals in front as the half ended, 28-23. The third period saw beautiful shots by Riley for the homesters and by Swartwood, Pinola, and Black of the visitors. Third stanza wound up with Bucknell trailing, 47-35. Although outscoring the HUC, 13 to 6 in the last canto, the charges of Coach Rudman came out on the long end of the score to win, 53-48.

Standouts, defensively, were Riordan, Williams and Apichella for the HUC, and Zukowski and Pinola for the upper-enders.
