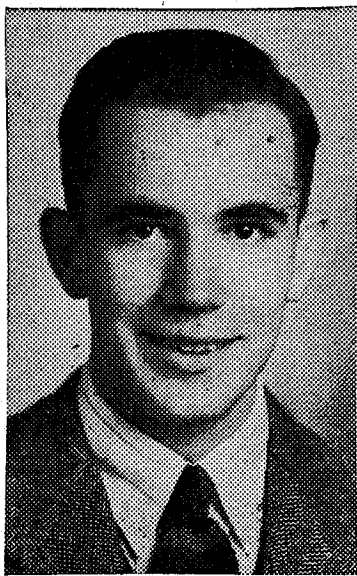

Geology Class Visits Penna Crystal Cave

Mr. Zerbe's geology class made a trip on Tuesday afternoon to Crystal Cave, Pa., where they enjoyed an interesting tour through the cave. The guide helped add color to his explanatory remarks by an effective use of his Pennsylvania Dutch accent.

The cave was found in 1871 when a group of men accidentally discovered it while blasting for limestone. Geologists believe that the cave was formed in the glacial period, many years ago, when rushing water washed away the loose strata.

The trip was made by automobile with six cars leaving from the Walnut Street Building at 1:00 p.m. Prior to departure, a member of the Hazleton Police Department halted highway traffic, making it possible for the group to leave together.
