## HUC Swamps Dubois: Garber Scores 20

The HUCsters gained sweet revenge last Saturday night when they smothered the DuBois Center five, 67-41. Led by Pistol Pete Garber, who banged in 20 points, the Hazleton boys took an early lead and maintained it throughout the game. The large crowd on hand had little to cheer about as the best the DuBois cagers could do was cut the lead to 32-25 at the half. With Garber hitting the mark steadily, the locals' margin grew to 48-29 in the third period. Hazleton racked up 19 more points in the final session to win going away.
