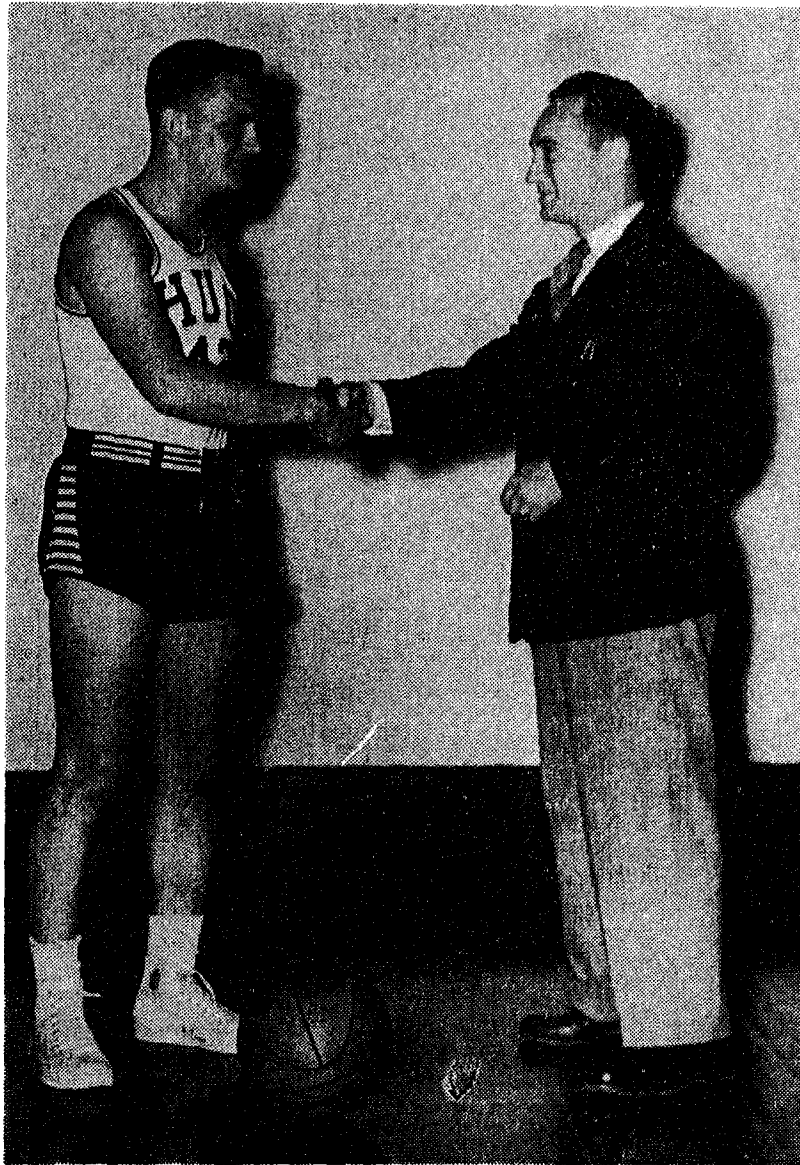

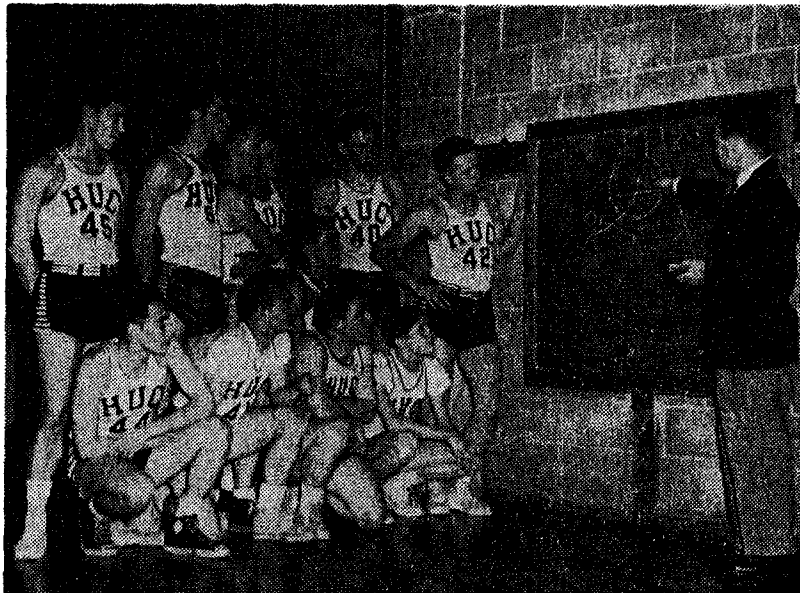
PHYS. ED. INSTRUCTORS MEET AT STATE COLLEGE

The German Club will sponsor an all-college dance December 2. Frank Thompsen, who is entertainment chairman, asks the "talented one's" to volunteer advice and services.

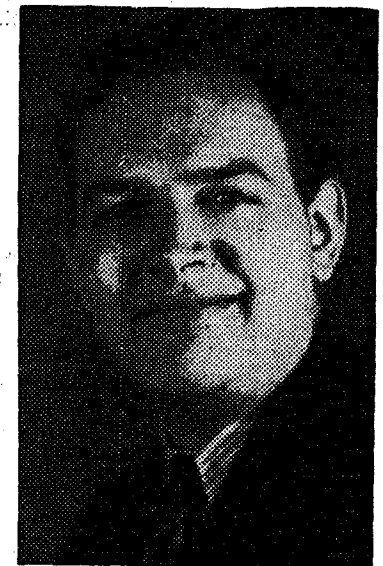
Future social affairs of the German Club will be limited to club members, officials announced last week. Memberships in the club are still being accepted from those who are studying German or those who have had it.

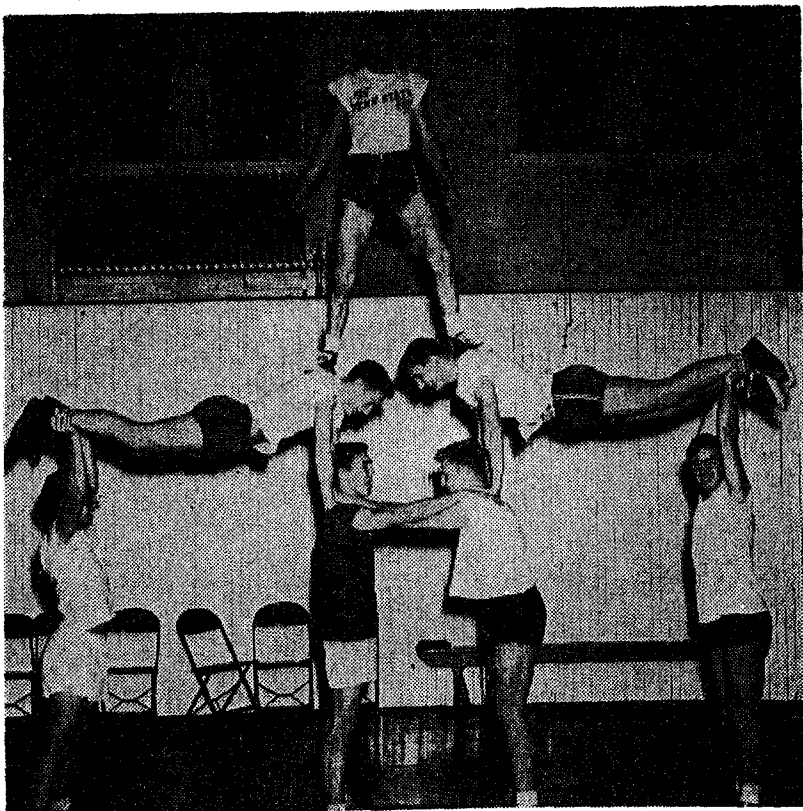
