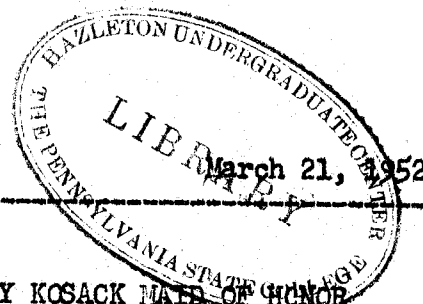

For her maid of honor, students elected Dorothy Kosack, daughter of Mrs. Tessie Kosack, Coaldale. The Queen represents the sophomore class; her maid of honor represents the freshman class. The election was supervised by Theta Sigma Pi and its adviser, Miss Florence Yannes.

Queen Josephine will reign May 10. In the afternoon in the garden at Highacres the coronation proper will be held with due ceremony. In the evening, the annual Coronation Ball will be held.
