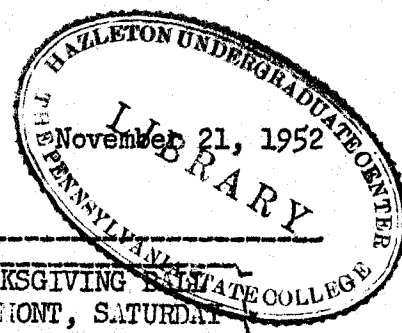

BASKETBALL SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED; SEASON OPENS DECEMBER 13

Preston Peightal, faculty manager of athletics at the Center, has released

the 1952-53 Mountain Lion basketball schedule. The twelve-game schedule is slated to open Saturday, December 13 at Waynesboro against Penn State's Mont Alto forestry school. According to latest reports, the conflict in date with the Christmas Ball has been solved.

The two games scheduled for Friday, February 13 and Saturday, February 14 are parts of doubleheaders. For Friday's game the Mountain Lions will go to Altoona to play Johnstown Pitt Center. In the other half of that double-header, Altoona will be pitted against a fourth team. Saturday the Lions will play Altoona at Johnstown, and Johnstown will see action with the fourth team.
