The hoopsters of Highacres, the Mountain Lions, bowed for the second time in league competition when they lost to Hershey Junior College 74 - 54, Wednesday, January 7.

Coach Antinozzi had to begin the game with only five available players because the remaining players were still out in the storm groping their way to the court. Bill Coll and Cyril Carroll used their thumbs to get transportation the last two miles to Hershey after the road on which they were traveling became blocked by an accident.

The holiday effects showed quickly on our players and could account for the "off day." However, Joe Scarcella with 18 points and Jim Ustynoski with 10 kept the team going all the way. Frank, playing the pivot spot, was close to the double scoring column with 9 points. Support was also received from Coll, Atherholt, Carroll, Kobrick, and Mistiszyn, the latter playing the full game. Don Krentz took time out from his great defensive play under the hoop to dump in seven points.

As for fouls, Hershey again took the honors. They made good 24 fouls out of 31 tries, while our boys were flipping in 12 out of 21 tries.

Our Mountain Lions play Pitt Center (from Johnstown) in Hazleton this evening. Let's give them some moral support; they are doing their share.
