ELECTION RESULTS

In one of the liveliest elections ever held at Highacres, over 90% of the registered students cast their ballots so evenly that the margin between victory and defeat for some candidates proved to be a matter of a few votes.

Mr. Mattern, faculty advisor for the student council, and the election board, released the results of the Oct. 1st election to the Collegian at 5:20 Thursday afternoon. According to Mr. Mattern the voting for Freshman Councilors was so close that the election board, consisting of Mary Danish, George Mastrian, Theodore Hervath, William P. Igrian, Mauro Walker and Matthew Galatha, was forced to recount the ballots to rule out the possibility of error.

The Sophomore nominees for class officers were uncontested, therefore Clarence Shipman was elected president of the class; James Griesing, vice-president; and Jean Haegle, secretary-treasurer. For the sophomore Student Council, however, the contest was closer with Jack Taluskie, Pat Tansho, Ray Atherton and Bill Burcin emerging the victors.

Freshman balloting proved to be a real headache for the election board as no less than nineteen candidates were actively campaigning for the six freshman offices. A recount was necessary before the board could release the results officially.

Norman Hall was elected president of the Freshman class; Robert Valick, vice-president and Terry Flynn, secretary-treasurer to complete the slate of class officers. The freshman council members were finally found to be Ellen Iffert, Jack Donovan and Jack Burggraf, only after the recount by the election board.

The Collegian staff wishes to congratulate our new student leaders and extend sincere wishes for success in fulfilling their offices faithful to the trust and confidence placed in them by the students of the Hazleton Center.
