

ENROLLMENT UP AT HIGHACRES -----

According to figures recently released by Mr. Kostos, assistant administrative head, enrollment here at Highacres has risen to the grand total of 210, which is an increase of 59 over 1951 and 52 over 1952. The school of engineering seems to be the most popular with an enrollment of 57. Following, are the School of Liberal Arts with 38; School of Business with 27; Chemistry and Physics with 24; Agriculture with 8; Education with 11, and Home Economics with 2.

Forty-six communities are represented with Hazelton naturally leading the group with 73 students. This year we have two out-of-state students in the persons of Lew Alexander, who hails from Washington, Indiana, and Howard J. Robinson from Lowell, Mass.

Coed enrollment jumped to 32. An increase of 11 over last year.
