


13 YEARS AGO

Do you know what anniversary we had on Tuesday? Well, if you do, you're better than the majority of people around Highacres. I was startled at the number of people who didn't remember that on December 7, 1941, the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor, bringing the United States into World War II. If so many people at Highacres do not remember this date, perhaps it is true that the American people, as a whole, are forgetting it.
