Discussion centered on the bill which reserved the right of USG to retract this authority anytime OSGA is unable to fulfill the responsibility. This clause is a safeguard to assure Senate passage of the bill, according to informed sources. It was reported that the time will come when OSGA cannot meet to select a representative.

Louise Ferrence, OSGA vice president, submitted a proposal for selecting the commonwealth campus representative. The bill was discussed, amended and passed. Three to five candidates for the Senate committee seat will be recommended by a selection committee. OSGA will elect the representative at its Spring Conference.

Robert Bauer, OSGA president, introduced proposed guidelines for the establishment of student courts on commonwealth campuses. The purpose of these guidelines, according to Bauer, are to provide continuity for all commonwealth campus student courts. Campuses establishing courts must follow the basic structure. The four campuses which now have operating courts will be required to make modifications in all appropriate areas.

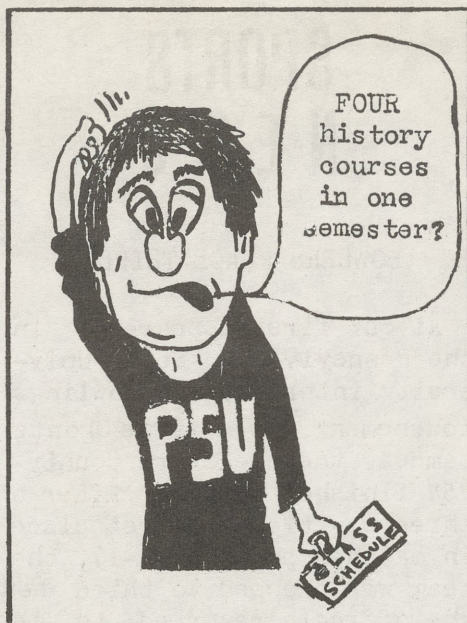

is probably best known to the public through its Neighborhood Action Centers. These centers deal with housing problems and provide tutoring service to children. There are four centers within the Chester city boundary, one in the borough of Media and one in Darby Township. GCM operates "Operation Head Start", which gives educational experience to preschool to poverty area children.

Through the "Opportunity Center" program G.C.M. has attempted to meet the problems of unemployment caused by inadequate education. These people receive basic educational courses and the vocational skills needed to afford them the opportunity to become self-

sufficient members of the community. The Neighborhood Youth Corps is the only paid work experience program available to the unemployed, disadvantaged, youth of the City. This program is provided solely on the basis of need.

Another G.C.M. program, "Operation Discovery" is an intensive, six week, summer program for talented youth from the urban areas with the highest incidence of cultural deprivation. The students in the program have demonstrated the ability to develop skills

leadership and social responsibility if given adequate opportunity.
