A series of six Philosophy lectures will be made available by the Delaware County Campus, and are open to the public without charge.

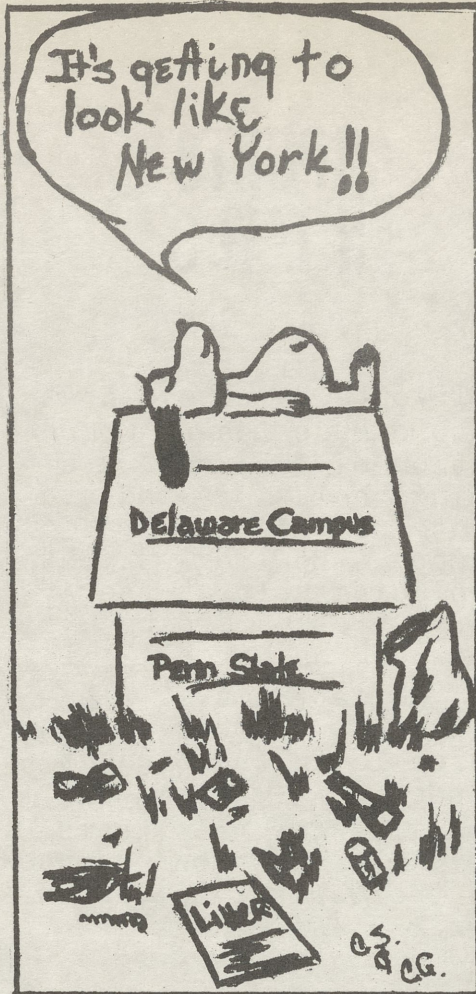

**At the Movies**

"Bonnie and Clyde"

"Bonnie and Clyde", nominated for ten academy awards, including Best Picture of the Year, is just that, the best picture of the year.

Bonnie Parker, the gun moll, is portrayed by Faye Dunaway. She joins up with Clyde Barrow, an ex-con, portrayed by Warren Beatty, and thus becomes the first member of the Barrow Gang.

Bonnie and Clyde's occupation was robbing banks with a little car stealing on the side. Knowing very little about cars, they persuade C.W. Moss, a "dippy" expert mechanic to join them. C.W.'s ignorance adds humor to the reproduction of a violent era in history.

The Barrow Gang membership expands as Clyde's brother Buck and his wife Blanche join the group. Blanche, who causes nothing but trouble with her delirious screams and continuous complaints, remains a part of the group only because she is Buck's wife and Buck is "family".

Upon Buck's death and her injury, Blanche becomes a glutton to the sheriff's interrogations about Bonnie and Clyde's whereabouts. She makes the mistake of telling him the name of their unknown companion, C. W. Moss. Bonnie and Clyde are ultimately done-in, in one great slow motion scene, with the aid of C.W.'s father.
