Discipline problems discussed

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — Perhaps one reason the old hickory stick was so effective was that the kids who teachers were tempted to use it on weren't in school.

"As recently as one generation ago, many potential disruptors left school voluntarily long before 16 — much to the relief of both teacher and student," says Dr. Robert L. Shrigley, professor of education at The Pennsylvania State University.

Dr. Shrigley teaches a course in classroom management available to aspiring teachers in Penn State's College of Education. He says the course, which he developed and first taught last year, "is designed to minimize student disruption to the degree necessary to keep the learning act afloat."

"That's more difficult than it was a generation ago," he notes. "Many social forces contribute to the problem. Those looking for simple answers won't find them."

He says the unmanageable adolescents forced to stay in school against their will until they reach 16 years of age can justify seeing the school as their enemy, especially if the school can't guarantee job security upon graduation.
