Tuition To

Increase Again

An automatic 5 per cent increase was included in the 1980-81 budget plan presented to the University Board of Trustees last week at University Park.

The plan marks the first time the University has ever proposed a state appropriations request based upon a predetermined tuition increase. In the past, funding requests were formulated without a tuition hike included as a source of revenue. Tuition was only raised when the State legislature failed to provide the University with the money requested.

Under the proposed plan, the 1980-81 budget for general University operations would be \$135,619,000.

Student Trustee Dave Hickton said he is "very much opposed" to the automatic tuition increase.

"In previous years the University has always taken the position that there would be no increase." he said. "That allows us to bargain from ground zero. With this position we are already starting at 5 percent."

If the legislature continues a 12-year trend of approving appropriations below the requested amount, a further tuition increase would be added to the built-in 5 percent.
