Keeping your car's tire pressure up to "full load" as recommended in the owner's manual can save you as much as 5 gallons of gas out of every 100 you buy. Although you'll get a little firmer ride, the tires are likely to last longer. Check pressure when tires are cool (invest in a good gauge since gas station indicators are often unreliable). Note: When tires are hot, pressures build up; it's normal.
