## **Enrollment Up**

- Penn State Intercom

Fall Term enrollment at the University totals 55,281 - a record for the second straight year, according to preliminary figures announced to the Trustees. The University Park campus, with an enrollment of 32,459, and the Commonwealth Campus System, with 17,709 students, also set records.

Individual Commonwealth Campuses that set enrollment records were Altoona (1,969 students, up 9.6 percent); Berks (934, up 10.7 percent); DuBois

(633, up 6.9 percent); Hazleton (1,128, up 9.5 percent); and York (1.016, up 6.4 percent).

University Park's 1980 enrollment showed an increase of 667 over 1979's total of 31,792. Commonwealth Campus enrollment showed an increase of 937.

Hershey Medical Center and the Radnor Center for Graduate Study also recorded enrollment increases this year.

All figures are preliminary and are expected to be slightly higher when final tabulations are completed.
