room, however, for only 129 people, so tickets will be sold on a first come, first serve basis. The trip will run as follows:

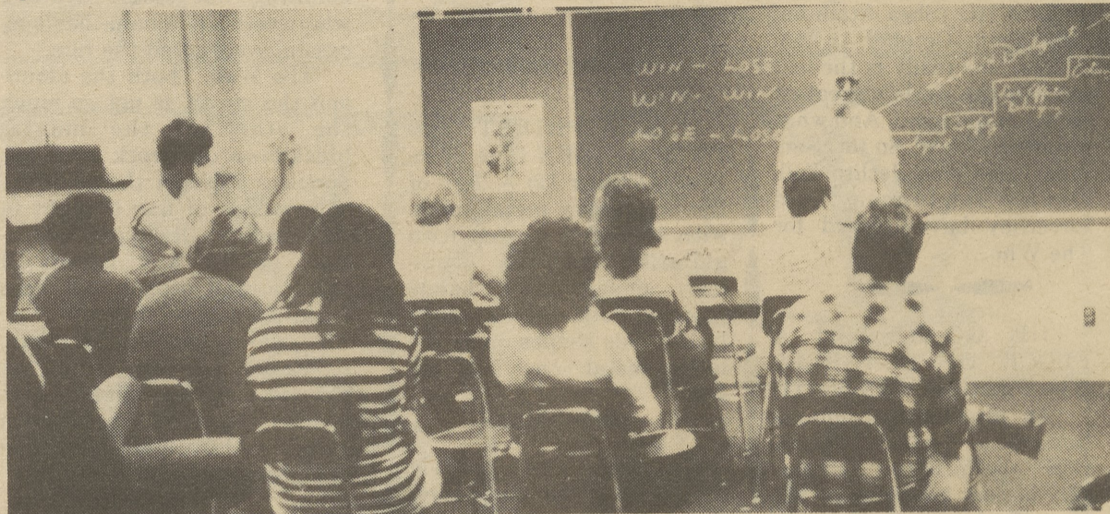
4:00 p.m. Friday, November 5, 1982; bus will leave Delco
