- 3.) Over 68 million dollars an hour spent on nuclear weapons - very much against

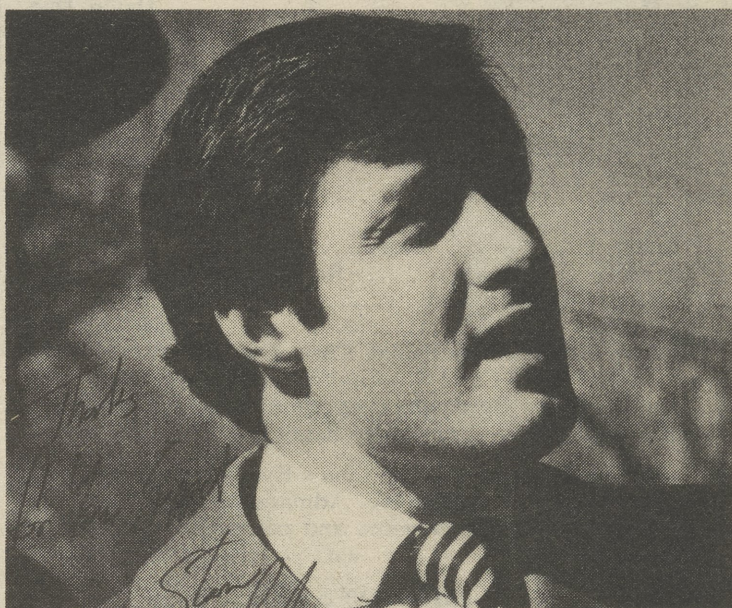
4. Reduce spending on military hardware - Put more money where it belongs - Social or Economic Programs.
