

Baseball Season Opens Next Week vs. Neumann

Baseball season opens next Monday with a game against Neumann College and the Delco team is READY! "Our first game could be a blowout," predicted freshman third baseman J.J. Scally, "at least a double-digit win for us because this is Neumann's first season." (Come out to the upper field at 3 p.m. and see for yourself!)

"We've been practicing every day for over a month," added freshman outfielder Keith Berry. "The weather's been good, and we also spend three days a week at the "Grand Slam" in Paoli for indoor batting practice. "Actually, though," he confided, "I think the money we spend at "Grand Slam" (\$60 a day) could be better spent on purchasing a portable netted-in batting cage for the campus. Then we could practice here."

Twenty-seven men, the majority of them freshmen, have been taking part in Delco's "spring training": fielding balls and batting practice, basically the fundamentals. All under Coach Jim Diskin's guidance.

"He's a nice guy," said Berry, "very enthusiastic, and he LOVES the sport."

The team also has the experience of a six-game fall season behind them. They only won one game, but the idea was to give everyone on the team equal playing time, not to run up the score.

"There are a few inexperienced players on the team," said Scally, "but most of the guys have played three years or more on high school varsity team."

The toughest teams Delco is expected to face this spring are Bucks County

Community College on April 3 (away) in Eastern Pennsylvania College Conference league play and PSU Ogontz on March 28 (home) which will count both as an EPCC game and a Commonwealth Campus Conference game.

Still, the team hopes to have a successful season. "At least 18 wins," Berry confidently predicts.

So come out to the upper field and cheer on Delco's Batmen. It will be your last chance to do it officially in the squishy mud of March and April since this will be the last spring season for Delco baseball. In August '90 baseball becomes a fall sport at Delco. This is because the more northern campuses in the Commonwealth Campus League can't find their practice fields under all the snow until the other team has already arrived for the first game. That's apparently too late for them; hence the move to a late summer/fall season.

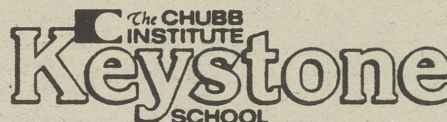
