Franz Makes History; Wins PSU Award

George W. Franz, assistant professor of history, has received a top University-wide award honoring him for his many contributions as a teacher, advisor and faculty leader. Franz was one of four professors from the Commonwealth Educational System to win the George W. Atherton Award for Excellence in Teaching.

Dr. Franz, who has been teaching at Delco since 1968, has a long list of achievements as an academic and community leader and last year was named the Teacher of the Year at Delco.

Dr. Ed Tomezsko, called Franz a "master teacher, deserving of the many accolades he routinely receives from peers and students." Tomezsko said that among the many qualities which distinguish Franz as a master teacher "is his uncanny ability to engage his students in the learning process without compromise to academic integrity or to the setting of high expectations."

Dr. Franz teaches standard American History courses and also has developed special courses at the campus in the Philadelphia colonial history and Pennsylvania colonial history.
