The last tournament of the year was the CCAC Tournament at University Park. This time we were matched up against the Commonwealth campuses of Penn State University. There were a total of ten schools at the tournament.

Delco and Berks all but dominated their divisions, with both teams remaining undefeated. Delco's semi-final match had them pitted against Ogontz. The first game of the best of three series ended in a hurry! Delco SHUT-OUT Ogontz 15-0 !!! In the second game Ogontz improved but, they scored only five points. As Delco Dismantled Ogontz 15-5.
