Nominations Sought for Teaching Award

Are you impressed with the enthusiasm and commitment, the academic advising and career guidance, and the general teaching ability a faculty member here at PSU Delco? If so, then consider nominating that person for the 1992 Penn State Teaching Fellow Award before November 15.

This award for "teaching excellence" is sponsored by the Alumni Association, the Undergraduate Student Government, and the Graduate

Student Association of Penn State, but any student, parent, alumni, staff, administrator, friend or other faculty member can nominate a member of the faculty for the award. The nominee must be full-time and have a minimum of three years teaching experience to be eligible.

The award, which consists of cash and an inscribed plaque, aims to honor distinguished teaching while "providing encouragement and incentive for teaching excellence at

Penn State," according to the award brochure.

Recipients are expected to share their talents and expertise with others throughout the University system by participating in workshops and symposia, giving lectures or presentations on teaching techniques for new faculty, by taking part in discussions or seminars with students in the University Scholars Program, or teaching honors courses.

Pre-screening of nominees will be done by each college and approved by the dean. Final selection, however, will be made by a University committee made up of three alumni, three faculty, three students, and one administrative representative appointed by the President of the University.

In order to be sure that the committee receives your nomination before November 15, pick up a copy of the nomination form now from Dr. Madlyn Hanes in Room 212L of the Main Building. The mailing address for the nomination is on the form.
