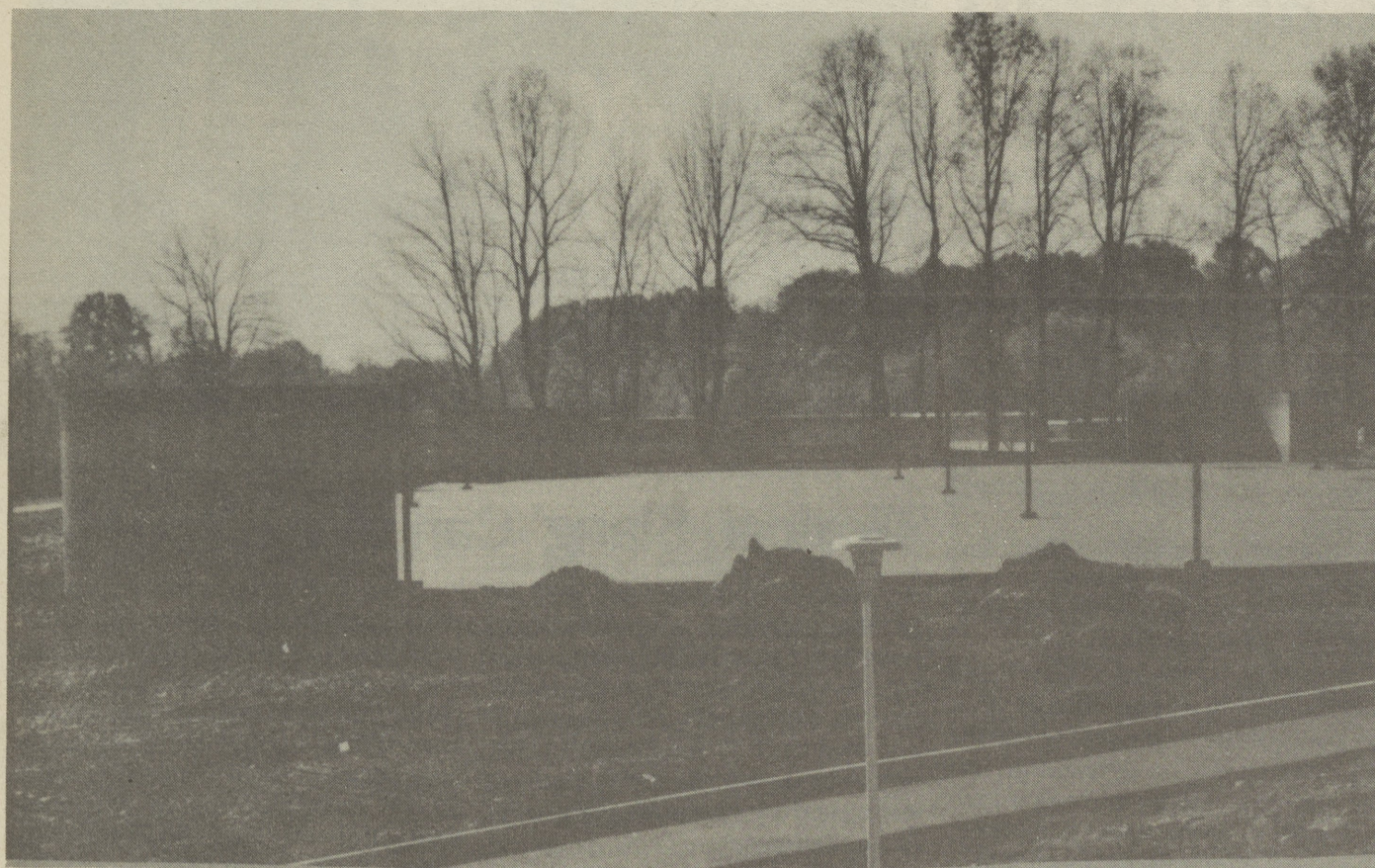

Even though the program was open to female students also, interest was minimal.

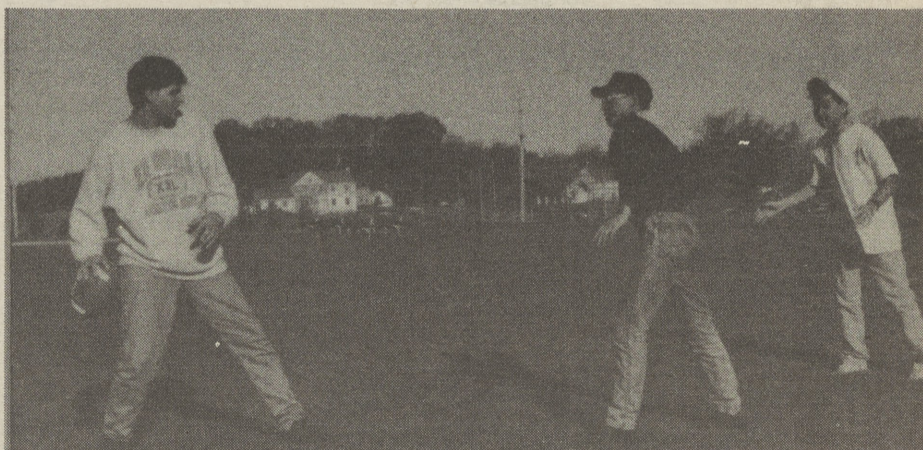
