

Marcel Carter was a fellow student of Penn State who had bone cancer. In 1991, a basketball game was held to raise money for his treatments. In January 1993, he died. However, the games still continue. The money goes to the American Cancer Society and is used for juvenile research.

The results of the tournament during its first year were very positive. There were many people who came. However, last year's tournament did not get as much support. Erica Parks, member of the Black Student League, says, "I am hoping to see a lot more people this year."

This year's tournament will feature Q102, Cheyney University, Penn State Delco, Penn State Ogontz, And West Chester University. Also, there will be a step show and performances by the American Defenders and rap group Bad to the Bone. The general admission is \$5.00 and \$3.00 with student I.D.

Erica Parks quotes, "I'd like to see a good turnout at the 3rd Annual Marcel Carter Basketball Tournament because the proceeds will benefit the American Cancer Society. It is also a chance for Penn State students to get to know area college university students and have a good time."
