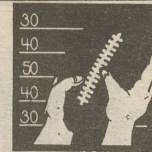

Most of Allen's playing experience comes from summer league ball in the Chester area, but this hasn't posed a problem for him adapting to the stricter nature of the

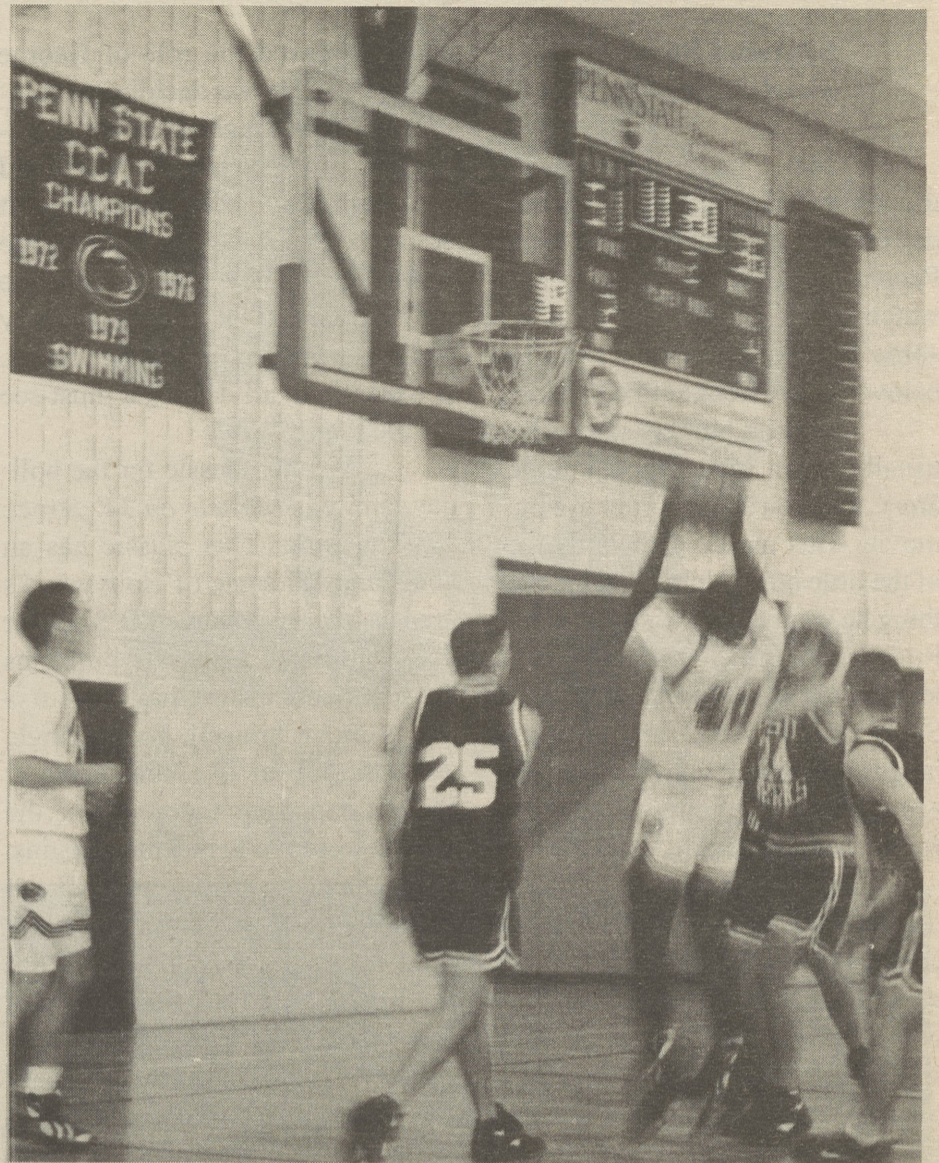
college game.

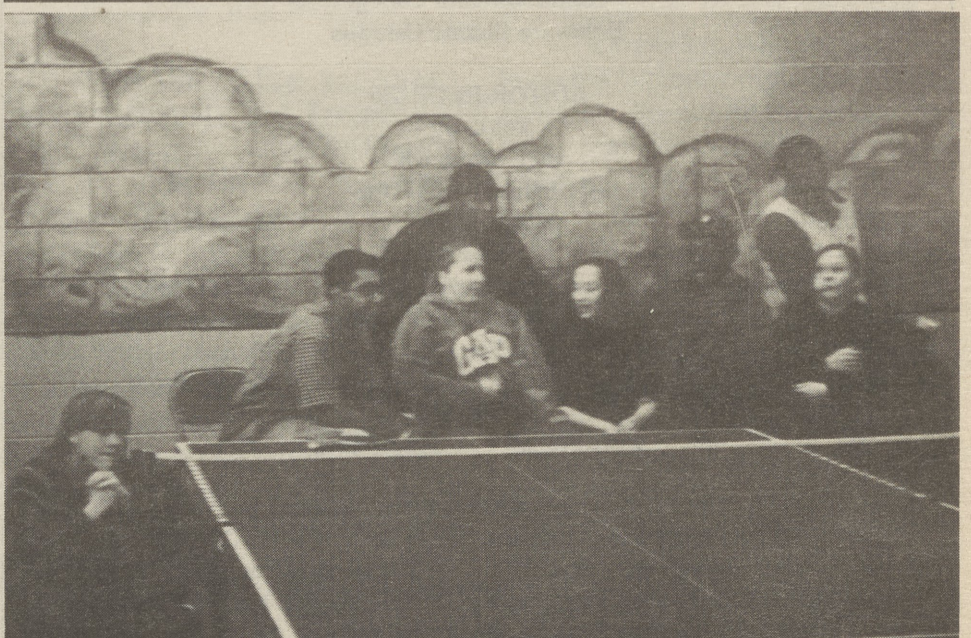
