The talk about the alleged change of the diplomas has reached some of the students. Many agree that changing the diplomas would be bad for the Commonwealth College, the University, and their students

"To have Commonwealth College on the diploma would, for lack of a better word, segregate students at Delco from the University Park students," said Marco Avendano, Freshman Information Science Technology.

Avendano, a mid-year transfer student from Delaware County Community College, based his decision to attend Penn State Delco on the knowledge that his diploma would not be different.

"This [the diploma] was actually a big factor coming into Penn State for me. It was one of the first questions I asked the councilor during my decision making process," said Avendano.

Bob Heise, Sophomore IST, commented, when he was told what the diplomas currently say, "That is the way it should stay," Heise continued, "We have one of the best IST departments in the University and I think it

would be bad to have a degree that is better than someone else's and yet have someone look down on it because it is a branch campus."

In July 1997 the Penn State's Commonwealth Educational System created the Commonwealth College to allow students to complete their majors at other campuses that University Park. The Commonwealth College now offers 14 baccalaureate degrees and over 20 associate degrees spread throughout the 12 campuses.

Penn State Delco has 8 degrees being offered including: American Studies, Business, English, Human Development and Family Studies, Information Sciences and Technology, Letters, Arts and Sciences, Speech Communication, Urban Early and Middle Childhood Education.
