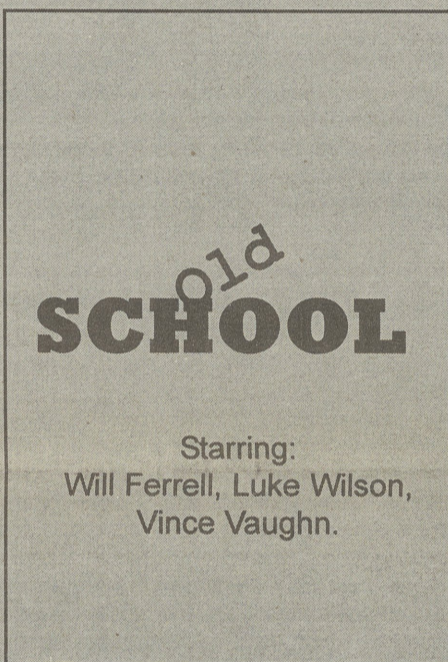
"Old School"

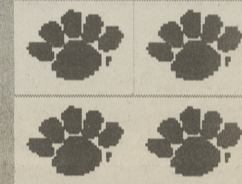
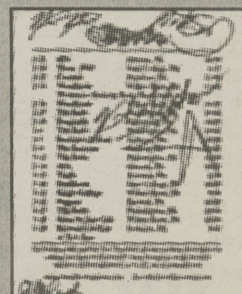
Abusing the power of a press pass, I beat my way stageside to get first crack at talking to the band.

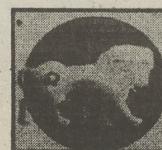
