Brandywine To Monitor Earthquakes

A member of Penn State University's department of geosciences at University Park will install an earthquake monitoring station on the Penn State Brandywine campus in the next few weeks. The station will be part of a new seismic network being established for the state of Pennsylvania and will be connected to the national network.

In the wake of the earthquake in New Jersey early Monday, this new technology could prove to be a valuable educational and outreach tool for students and the local community. Dr. Andrew Nyblade, professor of geosciences at University Park, is spearheading the Pennsylvania earthquake monitoring network. A member of his lab, Research Associate Jordi Julia Casas, will oversee the project on the Brandywine campus.

As many of our campus students are active volunteers, all are encouraged to consider working towards earning a President's Volunteer Service Award.

According to the President's Volunteer Service Award website, in 2003, President Bush created the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation to find ways to recognize the valuable contributions volunteers are making in our Nation. The President's Council on Service and Civic Participation created the President's Volunteer Service Award program as a way to thank and honor Americans who, by their demonstrated commitment and example, inspire others to engage in volunteer service. Recognizing and honoring volunteers sets a standard for service to others. It encourages a sustained commitment to civic participation and inspires others to make volunteering a central part of their lives.

The President's Volunteer Service Award recognizes individuals, families, and groups that have achieved a certain standard - measured by the number of hours served over a 12-month period. For young adults (average-aged college students), the bronze level award requires 100-174 hours of volunteering, the silver level award requires 175-249 hours of volunteering, the gold level award requires 250 hours or more.
