Top Show Animal Subject to Loss From Diseases

Just because an animal is a blue ribbon winner, the American Veterinary Medical Association points out it doesn't mean that it is any less susceptible to disease than the rest of the stock.
 This is the fair season when top breeding animals will be making the show circuit and certain precautions are recommended by the AVMA to prevent disease losses following the show season.
 When your local veterinarian prepares the various health certificates needed when your animals are taken to shear he should be asked about the type of health protection needed. He also can help with suggestions on how to care for the stock once the shows are over and they get back at the home farm.
 A few weeks isolation and close watching following the fairs is in order for the show stock. This period gives diseases a chance to show up before the animals are turned out with the rest of the herd. Some diseases take 30 days to appear, so the AVMA concludes that it is well worth the effort to keep stock isolated that long, especially when one considers what a disease could do to the entire herd.
