### Sales Tax Meets Approval from Pomona Grange

Calling on the Pennsylvania legislature and Gov. George M. Leader "to speedily enact a broad-based tax program," the Pomona Grange in Lancaster County last weekend went on record as favoring a state sales tax without exemptions for food and liquor consumed on premises where purchased.

Making up the resolutions committee at the meeting in the Lancaster YMCA meeting, were J. Collins McSparran and Edward James, Fulton Twp. Grange and Melvin Boyce, Colerain Twp.

The lack of adequate finances threatens "many of our rural school districts." "We reaffirm our former position of favoring a sales tax with the exemptions removed on food and liquor . . . where bought in hotel and motel rooms."

Exemption of farmers in taxes imposed on gasoline used on farms, and outlawing sales and possession of toy pistols, was also asked.

### Panel of Nine Seeks Better Poultry Trade

Problems of the poultry trade and suggestions for improving marketing procedures were presented by a panel of nine experts at the annual meeting of the Lancaster County Poultry Exchange late last week. The meeting was in the Rohrerstown Elementary School.

"The Mechanics of Poultry Marketing" was the topic. A quality bird must be marketed to build up poultry sales to meet competition offered by beef and pork. Herman Bloom of the Bird-In-Hand Poultry Co., representing the wholesale trade, and Herman M. Cook, representing chain stores, told.

### Views of Buyers

Views of buyers came from H. W. Longacre of Franconia and Daniel K. Good of the Producers Cooperative Exchange. The advantage of auction-type markets was emphasized by Jacob C. Herr, Gordonville, and Eugene Schlosnagle, Cumberland county.

Sales promotion was discussed by Leslie F. Hubbard of the Poultry and Egg National Foundation, while Mrs. Marian Granger of Dublin presented the housewife's view.

Others who spoke briefly were Max M. Smith, Lancaster County agricultural agent; Wayne B. Rentschler, Farm Bureau Cooperative, and A. G. Bucher, farm representative of the Lancaster County National Bank.

### Around 250 Present

About 250 attended the meeting and heard Mrs. Clara Kopf, exchange secretary, report that from 50 to 70 per cent of the 30 accredited buyers are active and an average of 645 growers listed birds an average of three times each last year.

Last year the Exchange handled nearly five million birds in 1,962 lots, and for the year and a half the Exchange has been in operation, the number is well over six million. An increase of 452,000 birds in the last four months was reported in comparing last year with 1954.
