
Extension of Milk and Egg **Production at New Records**

> HARRISBURG - All-time records for annual production ofmilk and eggs were established by Pennsylvania dairy and chicken farmers during the 12 months of 1955, the State Department of Agriculture said today following Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service surveys.

> The preliminary estimate for milk production, January through December 1955, totaled 6 billion and 452 million lbs, the Department said. This compares with 6 billion, 156 million lbs produced in 1954 and the 5 billion, 971 million lbs in 1953.

On the egg front, last year's output is estimated at 4 billion, 474 million chicken eggs — about 6 per cent above 1954 production and an astonishing 37 per cent above the 10-year annual average.
