This richly bred bull is out of the well-bred cow, Highland Beauty's Iota, that has a production record of 11,654 pounds of milk and 557 pounds of fat, made on two times daily milking for 305 days, as a junior three-year-old in the Herd Improvement calving requirements. He is sired by Highland Chief's King.

Royal Mausoleum of Baghdad

Carman Sets Record
PETERBOROUGH, N. H.—A registered Guernsey cow, Highland Beauty Della D, owned by J. Thomas Carman, Glen Rock, Pa., has completed an official production record of 11,031 lbs of milk and 594 lbs of fat, according to the American Guernsey Cattle Club. This production, made in the AGCC's Herd Improvement Registry, is equal to 5300 quarts of high-quality milk. "Della D" was a seven year-old, met calving requirements and was milked two times daily for 305 days while on test.

This official production record was supervised by Pennsylvania State University.

Madeira Cow Scores

A registered Guernsey cow, Herbert's K Andrea, owned by Herbert Schiffer, West Chester, Pa., has completed an official production record of 9,259 lbs of milk and 449 lbs of fat, according to the American Guernsey Cattle Club. This production, made in the AGCC's Herd Improvement Registry, is equal to 4400 quarts of high-quality milk. "Andrea" was a junior two-year-old, met calving requirements and was milked two times daily for 305 days while on test.

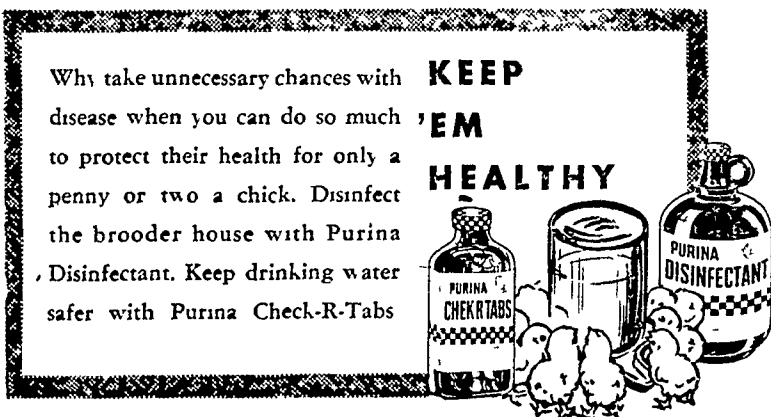
