State Farmers Win Gas Tax Refunds

A conference committee is expected to act in Harrisburg next week to grant Pennsylvania farmers 100 per cent refund on taxes from agricultural machine gasoline. Prior to this time, since 1949, a 50 per cent rebate has been allowed, at a cost of approximately \$400,000 a year.

A nine-month stalemate on the issue appeared cleared and Gov. Leader said Democratic legislative leaders agreed to go along with the 100 per cent plan proposed by Senate Republicans last year.

Red Rose Farm Herd Reduction Hits \$1900 Top

Averaging \$439, the 93 registered Holstein cows offered Tuesday in the Red Rose Experimental Farms herd reduction sale at the Guernsey Sales Pavilion, Lancaster, brought a total of \$40,800. Sixty cows in milk figured \$520 each.

Dairy machinery and equipment, also offered by the feed manufacturer, brought an additional \$5,316.75.

Top, \$1900, was paid by Grace View Farm, Port Deposit, Md., for the seven-year-old Red Rose Elmwood Winterthur. Second high was \$1200 paid by John S. Teeter & Sons, Taneytown, Md., for Red Rose Donna In-vincible Abby, a four-year-old. She sold bred to Willow Springs Crescent Prince.

Grand View Farm paid the third highest price, \$1000, for Red Rose Elmwood Winner, five and one-half years, sired by Winterthur Winner Fobes Don. The Teeter farm purchased 23 head totaling \$14,375 as high bidder in the sale.

The herd sire, a coming four-year-old, Butterfly Montvic Brigadeer, sold for \$400 to the Teeter establishment.

A crowd of 750 attended.

Many of the animals remained in Lancaster County. Nineteen heifers are being retained by Red Rose for experimental feeding research.
